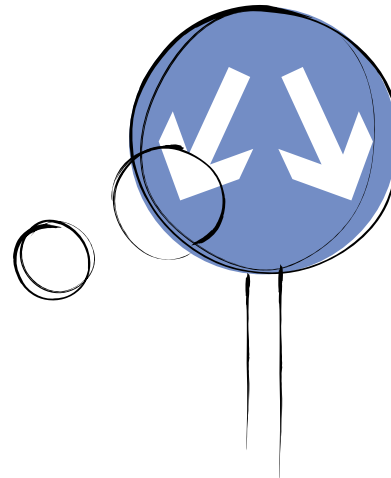

Intensive Supervision & Surveillance Order

What is ISSP?

ISSP stands for Intensive Supervision and Surveillance Programme. It is really the last chance you'll get before going to custody.

What's in it for me?

It's a chance for you to:

- Stop re-offending
- Get some help
- Get some education, training and even qualifications
- Think about the effects crime has on people, and 'pay back' for your behaviour
- Get involved in local sports and leisure activities
- Start believing in what you can do!

How does it work?

- You'll have an Advocate working closely with you, someone to chase you up, stand up for you and help you
- You'll get a timetable of all the things you have to do that week
- You'll be contacted at least twice a day to check you are where you should be
- We'll sit down with you and your family to work out a plan of work with you. This will include working on what you're good at too

ISSP normally lasts for six months

- The first half involves least 25 hours a week
- The second half involves less time but the ISSP team will be trying to get you into education or onto a training course

If you don't stick to the programme or if you get into trouble again you will go back to court very quickly.

What do I have to do?

- Work with us and stay out of trouble
- Keep to your agreement
- Be at home during your curfew
- Turn up on time and be polite
- Be at home for visits when asked

What are my rights?

- To be treated like we expect you to treat us
- Be listened to
- Not to be judged on your past

What happens if I break the rules?

You'll go straight back to court and may be sent to custody if you:

- Get into trouble with the police
- Leave home during your set curfew
- Do not keep appointments without good reasons
- Behave badly when with us

How will my supervisor know where I am?

- We'll check by phone on where you should be
- You'll have an electronic tag on your ankle to tell us you're at home when you should be
- Making or receiving phone calls to confirm where you are
